Thank you for your interest in placing a plaque on the pioneer wall.

It has been decided that to keep the wall attractive that the plaques will be limited to one size:

300mm x 150mm

As the wall is meant to reflect a historical theme, we do not wish it to look like a memorial. Therefore dates of births, deaths etc are to be excluded.

The samples shown will give you some idea on the type of information that can be included.

Each plaque will be struck in long lasting bronze and prices will depend on the size and number of words on the description. To give you some indication of cost at July 2019 prices started at \$415.00 for the first 10 lines, extra lines were charged at \$30.00 per line, plus freight and 10% GST. Based on 13 lines this would mean a cost of approximately \$555.50 plus freight.

Each plaque will be priced individually and you will be asked to approve the wording and pay for it prior to manufacture.

As soon as we have a proof ready we will forward it to you for approval together with an invoice for payment.

## BABETTE AND LEONHARD AUGUSTIN ABBIYED FROM GERMANY ON THE SHIP "GNEISENAU"

ON THE 25/3/1912 AT FREMANTLE.
FROM THERE, THEY WENT TO THE BUNTINE AREA BY HORSE AND CART,
OBTAINING WATER FROM ROCK HOLES ON THE WAY AND TOOK UP LAND
FOUR MILES SOUTH OF THE BUNTINE TOWNSITE.
LEONHARD STARTED RINGBARKING ON THE 29/9/1912.
BABETTE WAS THE FIRST WHITE WOMAN IN THE BUNTINE AREA.
TOGETHER THEY DUG A 1000m³ DAM, LEONHARD ON
THE PICK AND SHOVEL, BABETTE ON THE WHEELBARROW.
THE HOUSE THEY BUILT WAS OF BUSH TIMBER, THE FLOOR EARTH
AND THE WALLS WERE SUPER PHOSPHATE BAGS WITH AN IRON ROOF.
THEY HAD SEVEN CHILDREN AND FARMED TILL 1934.
