Rural Health West Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program 2023

The Shire recently participated in a Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program. This program is run annually in coordination with many other Shires throughout Western Australia. It aims to introduce medical students to the country to encourage them to consider rural work after graduation.

The students are hosted by community members who share country life with the students. This program is utilised Australia wide but it is the Dalwallinu first time Shire participated in the program. We assisted with the coordination of 20 medical students from Curtin University two lecturers, and a staff member from Rural Health West

This visit would not have been possible without the very generous host families agreeing to open their homes to the students and we would like to thank all of our hosts for this inaugural student visit. They are Gary and Kerry Butcher, Karen and Greg McNeill, Steve and Lee Anne Carter, Irene Mills, Diane and Jeff Cream, Charles and Gwen Hyde, Harry and Jane Hyde and Judy Flynn.

Gary Butcher was not only a host but he also agreed to be the bus driver for the visit. From the comments of the students this was a very popular choice and they appeared to have built a lovely rapport.

Several of the local business and organisations participated with the program and provided insights to what life could be like should they consider a rural career. They opened their doors willingly and we must acknowledge Coerco. Shermac, St John Ambulance, Dalwallinu Fire Brigade, Dr Femi, Dalwallinu Hospital, Staff at Dalwallinu District High School, Wubin Wheatbin Museum, Rob and Wendy Sawyer and Badimia Bandi Barna. Also the Shire staff and volunteers who were involved. Greg Whitehead and Kevin Jones were also roped in to be our BBQ chefs.

During free time they were able to visit the local stores, the recreation precinct and they participated in some of the local training sessions. They were very complimentary of our wonderful Dally Pool. As many were not used to the heat this proved a very welcome respite for them.

The students and host families, as well as invited guests attended a dinner on the Thursday night provided by Rural Health West but prepared by the Shire staff as a Thank You to everyone for their help. Students performed a "rap" for those present about their trip. Shire President Keith Carter was on hand to thank them all for coming to Dalwallinu and encourage them to return and bring their friends and family with them.

The entire group were presented with a Dalwallinu booklet and Dalwallinu medallion as a memento of their visit. By the end of the week they were all speaking like locals, no longer referring to Dalwallinu but simply affectionately calling it Dally like the rest of us.

We look forward to continuing this partnership with Curtin and Rural Health West in future years and we urge everyone to consider billeting a student next year. The experience is so worthwhile for everyone, not just the visiting students. All of the hosts this year said the experience was so rewarding.

Stage 1 of the construction of the new Multi-Purpose Early Childhood Learning Centre in McNeill Street is nearing completion. Stage 2 will see the external landscaping, demolition of the existing building and the construction of the car park. This is expected to be completed by July 2023.

The capital works on Annetts Rd has been completed and looks fantastic. The drainage was well and truly tested recently.

The two new subdivisions which are being undertaken by DevelopmentWA are still progressing. The WA Planning Commission has approved the nine (9) lot residential subdivision and we expect the approval for the eight (8) lot industrial subdivision to be not too far away. DevelopmentWA will now be calling for tenders for the civil works required to undertake the subdivisions in the coming weeks. If anyone is interested in any of these lots, please register your interest with the Shire.

Speed bumps have recently been installed on Johnston Street and Sawyer Avenue. Whilst we appreciate this may inconvenience some road users, these speed bumps are made to the relevant Australian Standard and have been put in place for the safety of the children. Please slow down when traversing these speed bumps.

A big thank you to everyone involved in the Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program that we hosted in mid-March. Deb Whitehead did an amazing jump with the itinerary for the students. This was the first time for Dalwallinu and we have received many positive comments. We look forward to this continuing and if we get at least one student moving to the rural area as a GP, that will be a great start.



Dalwallinu Gym - We take Safety Seriously

In late June all of the cardio equipment will be replaced with new equipment. We will increase the number of treadmills to 3 but reduce the number of cross fit machines to 1 as a result. The increase in membership at the Gym, whilst very pleasing means that more people are utilizing the area and using the equipment. All of our equipment has recently been inspected and assessed as in fantastic condition.

As the gymnasium is accessible 24 hours a day we remind all users to be responsible and wipe down each piece of equipment after use. Also if you are using equipment and it breaks or you notice something missing, please let the Shire Admin know. We cannot get it fixed or replaced if users don't inform the Shire.

And finally we take safety seriously. It is very important for all users to be safety conscious. This particularly relates to the safety bars on the weights machine. If you remove them from the machine you must replace them immediately you have finished with the apparatus. Failure to do so may result in an injury to the next user.

We also welcome any of our younger users to the gym. Please ensure you follow ALL safety procedures.

Be Aware and Prepare


Where there is minimal risk, Fire Danger Ratings will be set to 'No Rating". On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.


