Hope everyone had a safe and happy Christmas and New Year break.

In December 2023, we were advised that we had been successful with our Country Water Supply Grant applications through the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation. These two grants will subsidise the installation of 3 x 250,000L water tanks in Roberts Rd, Dalwallinu and 3 x 250,000L water tanks at the Kalannie Dam. These tanks will be used to store harvested stormwater so that we can use the water from the tanks to water our parks and gardens rather than using scheme water.

It was pleasing to see the number of nominations we received this year for the Community Citizen of the Year Awards and congratulations to the 2024 Active Citizen of the Year Winner Sam Dickins and to the Wubin Wheatbin Museum Committee. Your efforts are very much appreciated.

## **CEO Chit Chat**

Ceremony for fourteen (14) new Australian Citizens. Congratulations to those who recently chose to become Australian citizens.

Updates have been received from DevelopmentWA regarding the two new subdivisions in Dalwallinu. They hope to go to tender in the first quarter of 2024 with construction commencing in the third quarter. We will update you when we receive any information.

The Shire was successful with funding of \$500,000 from the Department of Fire and Emergency Cyclone Seroja Program. These funds have been utilised to purchase new generators for evacuation centres (Dalwallinu and Kalannie), a portable generator, 2 mobile lighting towers, a Visual Messaging Trailer and the construction of a 2x1 Modular home for 'emergency' accommodation. The purpose of this funding is to build resilience in rural towns.

Well done to the Aquatic Centre Manager for his successful application with Royal Life Saving WA for funding to provide swimming lessons for up to ten (10) of the Shire's Male Filipino Community. Kim was successful with this same grant for the Filipino women last year which was very well attended. As can be seen in the news recently, learning to swim is a vital life skill.

The Youth Lounge opened its doors on Thursday 18 January 2024. An official opening will be held once the Committee set a date. The Youth Lounge is open Tuesdays-Fridays from 3.00 to 4.45pm. Come along and take a look at what is on offer. The youth lounge is open to 11-17 year olds.

The Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network Road projects for this financial year have been put on hold. The Federal Government has

yet to sign the funding agreement, so contractors have been stood down until such time as the agreement is signed. Bell Road has been completed which just leaves the sections on Dalwallinu-Kalannie Road to be completed. These will now be held over to the next financial year due to availability of contractors.

The Annual Corella Cull will be held in Dalwallinu, Kalannie and Wubin on the weekend of 17 and 18 February 2024. As advised in January on Facebook, CBH will also be using a drone to scare the birds away from their sites in Wubin and Kalannie.

The Annual Electors Meeting will be held on Tuesday 6 February 2024 commencing at 6pm. If you would like to attend, please come along. A Community Meeting will be held in Kalannie on 26 March 2024 at 6pm, after the March Ordinary Council Meeting.

### **Projects**

Footings were installed on 31 January 2024 for the new ablution facility at the Dalwallinu Cemetery to be delivered in February 2024.

Works will be commencing on Park Drive (around Memorial Park) and Johnston Street (Shopping Precinct) in the coming weeks. We apologise for any inconvenience but as they say, there is no gain without pain.

We hope the improvements will create better drainage, additional parking and a more pleasing visual aspect to the townscape.

The Hockey Pavilion project is progressing well.

The Shire's new house on Bell Street should be ready for handover from the builders in early March 2024.

Finally in January we welcomed to the Shire staff Bradley Matthews as a General Hand.

The shire MWS and crew have given this matter urgent attention and the oval is already showing some improvement. Hopefully with professional advice and more water (rain would help to replenish town dams) the improvement will continue.

The truck fire north of Wubin with ammunition on board was handled cautiously and safely.

At the other extreme was the fire in scrub at Snake Gully. It was very sensible to let nature take its course and let the fire burn while continuing to monitor its progress.

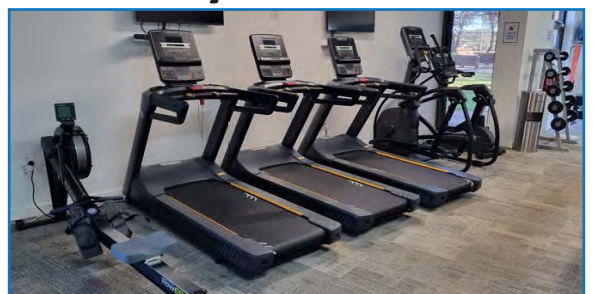

## Telstra to shut down 3G Network in June 2024



Telstra will be closing their 3G service on 30 June 2024. Telstra will be switching 3G off in mid-2024, which means you may need to upgrade your device.

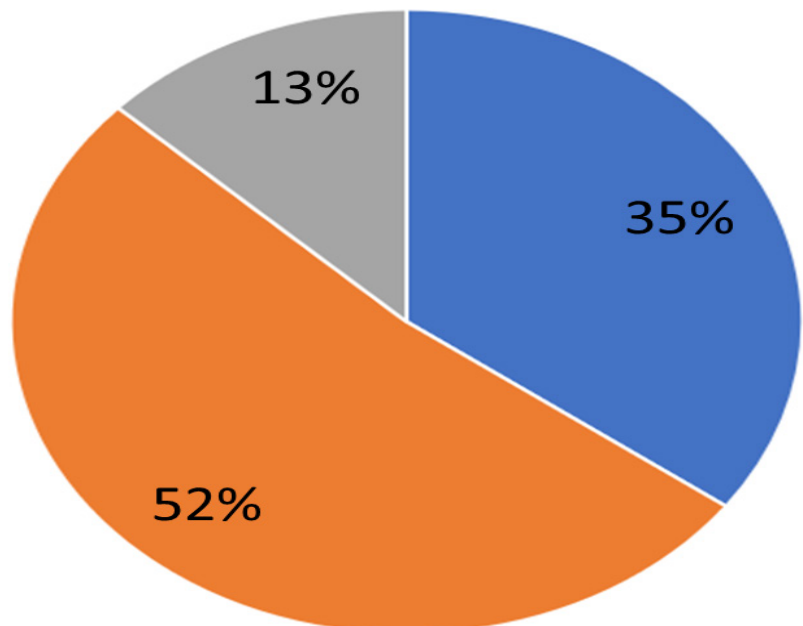
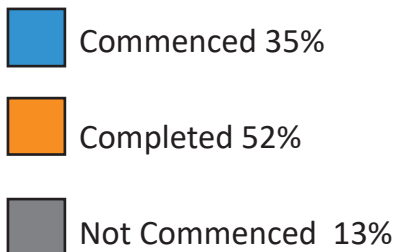
Telstra has announced the 3G network it introduced in 2006 will be switched off in the next five years to free up spectrum for the rollout of the 5G network.

The network will be switched off in June 2024, but between now and then Telstra will have to upgrade its 4G coverage to ensure regional customers in an area totalling around 770,000 square kilometres across Australia don't lose network access.

While this area is almost a third of the total area Telstra covers, the telco said only a very small percentage of customers would be affected.

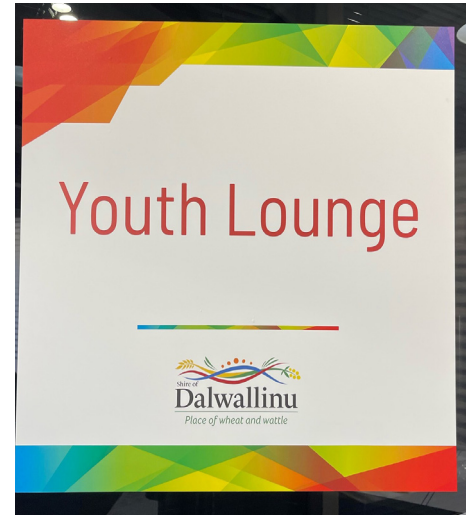
## Dalwallinu Discovery Centre & Library News

## Responsible Pet Ownership

The Cat laws are about encouraging responsible pet ownership and reducing the number of unwanted cats in the community and the number that are euthanised each year.

All cats that have reached six months of age are required by law to be:

- microchipped
- sterilised; and
- registered with the Shire

Under The Dog Act 1976 and regulations, any dog over the age of 3 months should be registered within the Shire.

All dogs need to be microchipped. Proof of microchipping is required at time of registration.

Please be a responsible owner and secure your animals by registration.

Legislation applies to Cats after six months of age and Dogs after 3 months.

Registrations are due on 31 October each year. Please don't risk losing your precious pets by not having them registered.

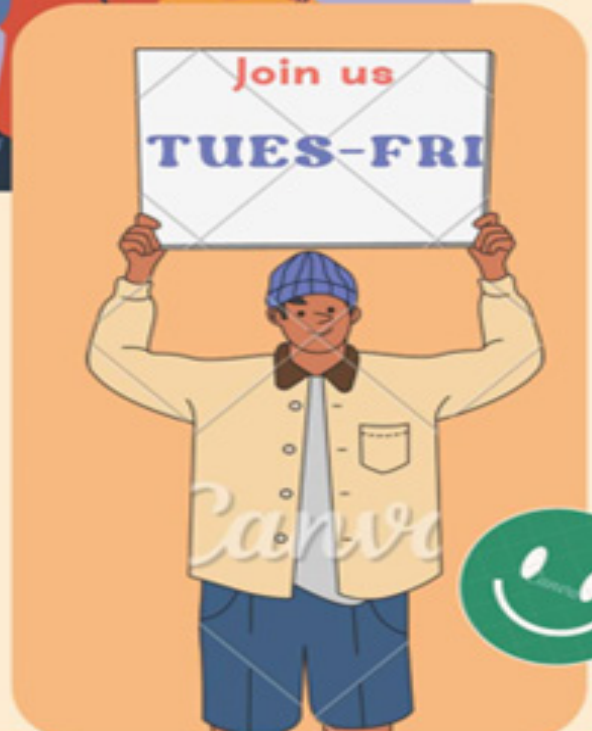
