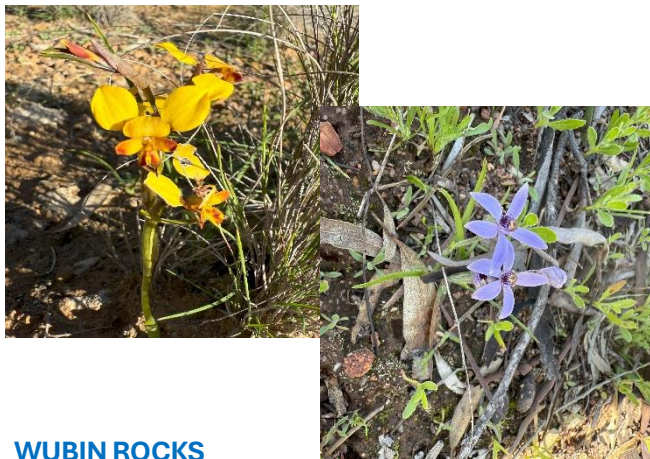


THE OLD WELL

Tucked away in Dalwallinu, the Old Well is a charming historical site nestled among a network of quiet bush tracks. During wildflower season, the area bursts into colour with blooming everlastings, golden wattle, donkey orchids, and blue fairy orchids. It's a peaceful place to enjoy a scenic walk while soaking in the beauty of nature and a bit of local history.



WUBIN ROCKS

There are patches of the pink and white everlastings scattered throughout this area. The wattle trees are becoming full of colour which only adds to the scenery at Wubin Rocks. Located 27km from Dalwallinu this spot is also a free self-sufficient camp.



HANDY HINTS

- Please do not pick the flowers
- When viewing the wildflowers, please ensure to park safely off the road
- Always check if unsealed roads are open before you travel
- Please stay on the designated paths and watch your step as it could be slippery

Dalwallinu Shire Wildflower Report September 2025



Discover Dalwallinu – A Wildflower Hotspot

Famous for its stunning natural displays during wildflower season. From colourful everlastings and native bush blooms to delicate orchids and the rare wreath leschenaultia, the area bursts into life with incredible floral diversity.

Dalwallinu also holds the world record for the highest number of wattle (Acacia) species, making it a top spot for nature lovers and plant enthusiasts. Wildflower season typically runs from **July to October**, but the timing can vary depending on rainfall. PETRUDOR ROCKS

Petrudor's granite outcrops are currently dotted with a beautiful mix of wildflowers. Spider orchids, leek orchids can be seen throughout the area, with a few pink candy orchids also making an appearance. the early growth stages of donkey orchids are visible, and their blooms should open in the coming days. Pink everlastings are scattered across the landscape, and the bright yellow blooms of the wattle are adding a lovely burst of colour to the surroundings.



XANTIPPE TANK

There are a few orchids to be found at Xantippe presently. During the peak season you will also come across Donkey Orchids & Sun Orchids. This is worth a visit if only to say you have been to the only locality in Australia whose name begins with "X." Xantippe is a short drive to Petrudor Rocks.



MIA MOON RESERVE

Mia Moon is a stunning wildflower destination. One of our most popular wildflower hotspots is putting on a show and bursting with colour. This picturesque area is home to a diverse range of native flora, including spider orchids, donkey orchids, blue fairy orchids, snail orchids, pink candy orchids, golden wattle, sweeping carpets of yellow pom poms and pink and yellow everlastings.



BUNTINE ROCK

While you may find some orchids near the base of the rock, the views are spectacular from the top where you will be rewarded with 360° panoramic views of green and gold paddocks and bushland reserve.

JIBBERDING RESERVE

Jibberding reserve is awash with an array of white pom poms and pink and white everlastings. There is a drive through track through reserve while the area also offers a free self sufficient camping. A picture perfect spot to spend the night.



WASLEY ROAD

(OFF GREAT NORTHERN HIGHWAY WUBIN)

Our spectacular **wreath flowers** are currently putting on a beautiful display. At the moment, many of the wreaths are either in full or partial bloom, while others are just beginning to emerge. These unique and iconic wildflowers are truly one of nature's wonders—distinctive in their circular shape and vibrant colour.
