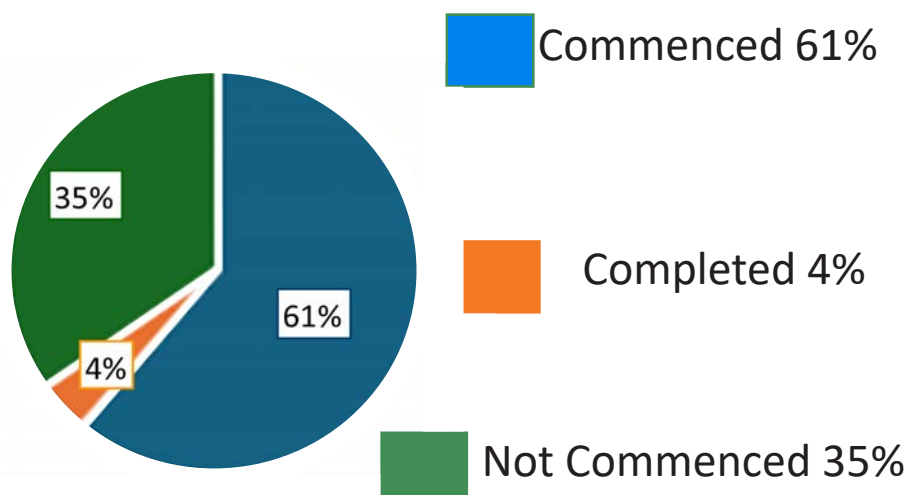

Free WiFi

Free Wi-Fi has been installed at the Dalwallinu & Kalannie Recreation Centre's via the STAND program.

STAND is the Australian Government's Strengthening Telecommunications Against Natural Disasters program.

Through this initiative, the government partnered with NBN Co to install emergency satellite Wi-Fi at the Shire's Recreation Centres.

CEO Chit Chat

And just like that another budget has been adopted. Council adopted the 2026-2027 budget on 21 July 2026. This year's budget includes:

- \$5.16 million on Roadworks;
- \$903K on improvements to the Cemetery, replacement of the pool liner, new bowling green surface in Dalwallinu, fencing along the perimeter of the Rec Grounds and a shade shelter over the playground in Kalannie;
- \$178K on footpaths in the Dalwallinu townsite;
- \$1.37 million on buildings including repainting the medical centre roof, upgrades to employee and community housing, repairs to the craft shop building, repairs to the ablutions at the Dalwallinu Caravan Park and construction of 3 Aged/Community units (subject to grant funding);

- \$785K on a 30,000L diesel fuel tank with swipe card access, new plant including a loader, utilities, mower, tractor and sewer tank.

Further information about the budget can be found in the Rates Information Sheet included with your Rates Notice. Rates have been issued for this year, so if you have not received yours, please contact Christie at the Shire Admin Centre.

Community Wi-Fi through the Strengthening Telecommunications Against Natural Disasters (STAND) Program has now been installed at the Kalannie & Dalwallinu Recreation Centre's. This provides free Wi-Fi to the community.

The marketing of the Buntine CWA building created a media storm recently. We were in an article in the Sydney Morning Herald as well as the ABC and Channel 9 news! Offers for the Buntine CWA building close on 14 August 2026. At the July Council meeting, Council accepted an offer for the Wubin Town Hall and resolved to re-advertise the Buntine Town Hall with offers closing on 19 August 2026.

Save the Date – Annual Street Party is scheduled to be held on Friday 11 December 2026. Shire Officers are well and truly in the planning phase for this event.

Adopted budget 2026/2027

On 21 July 2026 council held a Special Council Meeting and adopted the budget for the coming 2026/2027 financial year.

Staff led by Manager Corporate Services Hanna Jolly, CEO Jean Knight and Manager Works & Services Marc Bennett have produced a good budget while keeping the rate increase to 3.5% which is below the CPI.

The budget includes \$5M on roads, and several footpath upgrades, a new loader, and a 100hp tractor and flail mower which improve the mowing quality on the playing fields.

Subject to grant funding an important inclusion is 3 large water tanks for the Nugadong airstrip for firefighting and also more units for Aged Housing in Meyers Street.

There are other exciting projects in the planning and with a responsible budget we were still able to put money into reserves if these projects go ahead.

Wubin Town Hall

It is a pleasure to announce that council has accepted the tender for the sale of the Wubin Town Hall and supper room. This is a very good result after the previous tender was withdrawn prior to settlement. We look forward to the development of the building by a former resident of the Shire.

I think this shows the good standing the community is held in with most health, and education services available plus good employment opportunities.

Buntine CWA Building

The advertising of the Buntine CWA building for sale by tender created a media frenzy the likes of which not experienced before. With a price from \$22,000 the word was it was Australia's cheapest house, a residence cheaper than a small car.

The power of the media! Interest came from everywhere and this created a huge workload for staff with near 150 email enquiries in 48 hours.

On the positive side numerous tenders have been made and we should soon see another ratepayer in Buntine.

Chief Executive Officer leave

Early in July our Chief Executive Officer Jean took some well deserved leave. Thank you to Hanna Jolly our Manager Corporate Services for once again assuming the role of acting Chief Executive Officer.

The office continued in the usual efficient manner despite Hanna focusing on completion of the budget.

We are fortunate to have a great team in the office and I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge all the work they do.

5.20 Management of Verges

History:	New
Policy	The Shire is responsible for public safety in the road reserve and has authority to instruct the adjacent property owner to make the verge safe. Property owners are responsible for the care and maintenance of the verge adjacent to their property. Pedestrians have right of access to the verge. Public Utilities, such as Telstra, NBN, Water Corporation, and Western Power require access to their services in the verge area. If they need to repair their services, then they are not legally required to reinstate the verge development to their original condition. As a minimum, verges will be levelled. The Shire is committed to creating a visually appealing, safe and sustainable environment. Shire appreciates the contribution that residents make regarding the landscaping and maintenance of verges adjacent to their properties. The Shire is of the view that property owners should take responsibility for the landscaping, irrigation and maintenance of street verges adjacent to their property.
Objective	This Policy is intended to provide guidance on the management of verges within the Shire of Dalwallinu.
Scope	The verge is the area of land between the kerb and the property boundary. The purpose of the verge is to provide an area where public utilities/services such as power, and telecommunications can be located. The verge is also a public open space recognised and valued for its street trees and streetscape environment. Officers, residents/owners, builders, developers, contractors, representatives, and event organisations are all required to comply with this Policy.

No Spray Sign

1. Property owners may apply for a No Spray sign to be installed on their verge, subject to the following conditions:
2. Signs purchased at the applicant's cost
3. Signs to be installed by the Shire of Dalwallinu.
4. The property owner giving a commitment to maintaining their verges and keep them free of noxious weeds.
5. The property owner agreeing to keep the area free of hazards and nuisances. Failure to comply may result in removal of the treatment by the Shire at the property owner's expense.

Shrubs and Groundcovers

1. Subject to keeping the verge clear for the first 3.5m width from kerb or seal a dry garden style of small vegetation, shrubs and ground covers (to a height of 40cm including mulch).
2. Groundcovers or shrubs shall be planted greater than 2m away from a path, driveway, public utilities or any other structural element within the verge.
3. Local native plant species that require minimal water, fertiliser and on-going maintenance are preferred.
4. Whenever possible, planting, even with irrigation, should be undertaken during the months May to September.
5. All plantings should be mulched to reduce water evaporation.
6. Property owners are to be mindful of plants that may be poisonous and toxic.

Grass

1. Pennisetum clandestinum (kikuyu) is recommended for its drought tolerance.

Organic Mulch

1. Mulch shall be placed to a minimum recommended settled depth of 75mm.
2. Suitable mulch includes pinebark, shredded green waste older than 15 months or similar. To reduce the risk of spreading Phytophthora Dieback, mulch should be sourced from reputable suppliers.
3. Peat moss should not be used in any mulch application.

Irrigation

1. Dial 1100 for Dial before You Dig or go online prior to any works commencing on site.
2. Waterwise design principles must be incorporated into irrigation designs for planted and grassed areas.
3. Water usage shall be in accordance with Department of Water legislation, with respect to watering times and hours.
4. Where in-ground irrigation is installed to grassed areas, no part is to protrude above ground level except for pop-up sprinklers during operation.
5. The location and type of spray outlets must be selected to avoid water spray onto roads, crossovers, paths and other paved areas.
6. Irrigation controllers and valves shall be installed within the private property boundary.
7. The Shire of Dalwallinu takes no responsibility for any damaged irrigation.

Other Permissible Verge Treatments

The use of hardstand treatments other than for paths and crossovers is not normally encouraged within the Shire for safety, drainage,

environmental and aesthetic reasons. The following treatments are allowed but require written permission from the Shire:

1. Paving;
2. Synthetic turf; and
3. Compact aggregate – ferrocrete, cracker dust or road base.

For these treatments to be considered on any portion of the verge, an Application to Alter Verge Form must be submitted to the Shire. If you are considering installing a vehicle crossover, refer to the Crossover information and Specification for the Construction of Vehicle Crossovers.

Paving, Synthetic Turf and Compact Aggregate

The Applicant is responsible for:

1. Installing the paving, synthetic turf or compact aggregate as per the detailed plan submitted with the Application to Alter Verge Form and approved by the Shire.
2. Maintaining the paving, synthetic turf or compact aggregate in a safe and sound condition.
3. Reinstating the paving, synthetic turf or compact aggregate at the Applicant's cost in the event that any Shire or government utilities have reason to disturb the treatment to work on their infrastructure.
4. Paving, synthetic turf or compact aggregate must be installed with the finished levels, where possible, collecting the water and where possible, directing water flow into the tree well(s) or garden beds.

What isn't allowed on the Verge?

Verges provide a buffer between the road and private property where essential services and public infrastructure may be located. As access to these services may be required some hardstand treatments are not permissible in the Shire of Dalwallinu.

The following cannot be installed on the verge:

- Nuisance trees (anything with thorns);
- Asphalt;
- Bitumen;
- Concrete;
- Edible gardens;
- All structures including walls, planter boxes and seats;
- Loose aggregate – pea gravel, blue metal, crushed brick or stone aggregate;
- Large rocks; and
- Water features.

Weed Control

In addition to the Shire's obligations to also control Declared Plants and Pest Plants on Shire managed land, the Shire will conduct annual roadside verge management activities addressing weeds and vegetation within the road shoulder, drains and batters.

Verge Development Approval Process

All proposals for landscape treatment of the verge require approval from the Shire of Dalwallinu. In order for applications to install landscape treatments on the verge to be assessed, property owners are required to submit in writing an outline of the landscape proposal which includes a diagram to illustrate the proposed work including plant species and the layout of any proposed reticulation system(s).

The Shire will then inspect the location and notify the owner in writing whether the Shire supports or does not support the proposed landscape development.

On completion of any approved works an inspection will be undertaken by the Shire. Where works are not carried out in accordance with approvals, the applicant will be required to address any instances of non-compliance at their cost.

The Shire will maintain a register of applications and approved verge treatments.

Non-compliant Verges

The Shire of Dalwallinu reserves the right to remove any verge treatment without liability for compensation.

Census 2026 - Tuesday 11 August

From late July 2026, households will receive instructions on how to complete the Census. You can complete the Census as soon as you get your instructions, if you know where you'll be on Census night. Most households will get a letter with instructions to complete the Census online. If you get instructions to complete online but would prefer a paper form, you'll be able to request one.

Some points to remember about the Census Information collected

You need to complete the Census wherever you are staying on Census night.

If you're travelling in Australia on Census night, you still need to complete a Census form for wherever you are staying.

If someone is completing the Census form at your usual address, you'll need to be marked as 'away' but usually living at the dwelling.



Data collected in the Census matters

Data collected in the Census helps community organisations, businesses and governments make informed decisions. Government agencies reference Census results when assessing grant applications. The more correct the information, the more options become available to local governments. However, this is a direct result of correct information being collated.



Your information is safe.

Your personal information is private and protected by law. Private means the Australian Bureau of Statistics will not share your information with anyone. You can find out more about how they keep your information private on their website:
