Thank you for your interest in placing a plaque on the pioneer wall.

It has been decided that to keep the wall attractive that the plaques will be limited to one size:

300mm x 150mm

As the wall is meant to reflect a historical theme, we do not wish it to look like a memorial. Therefore dates of births, deaths etc are to be excluded.

The samples shown will give you some idea on the type of information that can be included.

Each plaque will be struck in long lasting bronze and prices will depend on the size and number of words on the description. To give you some indication of cost at July 2023 estimated prices start at \$480.00 for the first 8 lines, extra lines are charged at \$38.00 per line, plus freight and 10% GST.

Each plaque will be priced individually and you will be asked to approve the wording and pay for it prior to manufacture.

PLAQUES EXAMPLES

JOHN AND MARY SMITH

Arrived from England on the ship "Spirit of Adventure"
On the 25/6/1911 at Fremantle Harbour
From thence they ventured forth to explore by horse and cart the area surrounding Wubin before settling in Dalwallinu.
John was a shepherd and together with Mary they cleared the land for stock.

Water became a priority and then dug a dam on the land using only picks and shovels.

Mary raised eight children whilst working alongside John. They died in 1955 together at their property during a storm.

MARY-ELLEN SMITH "Smithy"

Arrived in Kalannie in 1959
Was instrumental in establishing CWA sub branch
Operated local store for many years
Was a volunteer ambulance driver
Dedicated her life to rehousing abandoned and stray animals
Smithy never turned a stray away.

THE SMITH BROTHERS

ARTHUR BERTRAM SMITH

Came to Dalwallinu in search of work aged 20 years in 1910. He worked for the Shire Board for 35 years until his death in 1945.

He served with distinction in WW1 from 1914-1918.

CHARLES DAVID SMITH

Followed his brother her in 1913. He worked on the land until tragedy struck in 1914 and he was accidently killed by a falling tree

SMITH FAMILY

GEORGE HAROLD SMITH AND HIS WIFE DOROTHY TOOK UP A WAR SERVICE BLOCK AT JIBBERDING IN 1948. THEY RAISED EIGHT CHILDREN ON THE FARM THEY CALLED COOPERS CROSSING.

GEORGE SERVED AS A COUNCILLOR AND WAS SHIRE PRESI-DENT FROM 1968 TO 1988. DOROTHY WAS VERY INVOLVED IN THE LOCAL COMMUNITY AND WAS A BUSY AND PRODUCTIVE MEMBER OF MANY ORGANISATIONS. IN RECOGNITION OF HER SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY SHE RECEIVED AN OAM IN 1990.
