If you would like to get fit, or just maintain your health, contact the Shire now on 9661 0500 to discuss your options for joining this facility.


You do need to be a financial member of the gym to utilise the gym and use the equipment.





BUSHFIRE INFORMATION 2022/2023 FIREBREAKS

NOTICE TO ALL LAND OWNERS AND/OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND IN THE SHIRE OF DALWALLINU

BUSH FIRES ACT (AS AMENDED) SHIRE OF DALWALLINU - FIRE BREAK ORDER A reminder that <u>all firebreaks were to be installed by 1 October</u>. Given the growth of vegetation during winter or spring, early attention will ensure a good result and reduce potential fire hazards.

PLEASE NOTE: FIREBREAKS MUST NOT BE LESS THAN TWO POINT FOUR METRES (2.4) IN WIDTH FIREBREAKS MUST BE INSTALLED AND MAINTAINED AND CLEARED OF FLAMMABLE MATERIAL UP TO AND INCLUDING 1 APRIL.

THE PURPOSE OF FIREBREAKS IS TO STOP FIRE SPREADING, TO ALLOW ENTRY FOR FIRE FIGHTING VEHICLES AND TO PROVIDE A BREAK FROM WHICH BACK BURNING CAN TAKE PLACE TO CONTROL A FIRE.

HOW TO OBTAIN FIRE PERMITS

Burning permits can be obtained from a Fire Control Officer. When applying for a permit you will need to provide the Lot Number and Street Name of the property for which the permit is to apply.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO INFORM THE SHIRE PRIOR TO BURNING WHEN TO OBTAIN PERMITS Permits are required for burning bush and grass at any time between 1 - 31 October and 15 February - 15 March in all areas. No burning is allowed between 1 November - 14 February

Dalwallinu Discovery Centre

Wildflower season is nearly over for another year. We have had a great year, with over 5000 visitors coming into the Discovery Centre between July and September. The late rains meant the season went later than usual and we opened on the September long weekend to accommodate.

Many thanks to Kalannie CWA and our casual staff Tania and Suzanne, who made it possible for us to open 7 days per week from early August. We have received great feedback from visitors regarding the DDC and the quality of information provided, not only for our Shire but for surrounding locations as well.

Our focus now turns to other tourism related projects and we are working with Bruce Maslin from the WA Herbarium to get our town trails project underway. Watch this space as we progress with the project.

Library News

Dalwallinu Library recently received grant funding from the State Library of WA for the purchase of a cellular enabled iPad and keyboard, a MacBook and earphones to expand the range of services we offer. The items are available for use in the library and will improve the library home delivery service by making the library catalogue available to house bound patrons.

A reminder to library e-resource users that the Overdrive app will be discontinued from early in 2023, and the Libby and Kanopy apps will be expanded. If you have not already downloaded these apps you will need to do so to continue to access State Library e-resources. Call into the library with your device if you need help to install or set up the apps. The magazines that are currently available on Overdrive are now available also on Libby and in future Libby will be the app to use for all reading materials whilst Kanopy is for visual materials such as movies.



Library on Wheels



Every fortnight, the Dalwallinu library hits the road to deliver library books to people who are unable to attend the library in person. The service operates every second Tuesday and goes to the hospital, Acacia House, Pioneer House and private homes in Dalwallinu for a collection of avid readers who have eclectic tastes ranging from thrillers, romance and family sagas to history, biographies and stories about animals.

The books are available in formats from large print to audio books and normal print. It keeps us on our toes trying to find new materials for people who consume books in the way other people consume food and is the highlight of Jo's week when she succeeds.

This will also facilitate a "click and collect" for people who are able to select materials to be issued and collected at a later time by a family member or support person. Mozzies are Back in Force



How to avoid being bitten

- At home screen all doors and windows, doors should be self-opening and open outwards
- When camping screen caravans, tents, swags and other sleeping equipment
- Wear long, loose fitting and preferably light-coloured clothing
- Use repellents containing DEET (diethyl toluamide) or Picaridin
- Recognise and avoid areas of mosquito activity such as swamps, marshes, billabongs and rivers floodplains

How to eliminate Mosquito Breeding in Your Backyard

You can take simple steps to help eliminate mosquito breeding in the community and you can do this by starting in your own backyard. Some of the things that you can do to help eliminate mosquto breeding include;

- Dispose of all containers which hold water
- Keep ornamental ponds stocked with mosquito eating fish eg goldfish
- Keep swimming pools well chlorinated and filtered and free of dead leaves
- Fill or drain depressions in the ground that hold water
- Fit mosquito proof cowls to vent pipes on septic tank systems. Seal all gaps in septic tank lids and ensure that leach drains are completed covered
- Screen rainwater tanks with insect proof mesh, including inlet, overflow and inspection ports
- Ensure guttering does not hold water


Dalwallinu Directory 2022-2023 - NOW AVAILABLE
