The Shire are extremely proud that the Electric Vehicle Charging Station is now fully operational and that we have had our first customers.

This installation was fully funded by the Shire of Dalwallinu and is an initiative from the Shire that hopes to draw the EV owners further north to be able to explore our wonderful Shire. Without the ability to re-charge in Dalwallinu this area would not be accessible to the owners of this new technology, as their range was restricted to the coastal and metro areas of Western Australia. The Shire President and I attended a Heads of Agency breakfast during the WALGA Convention in September 2023. We once again highlighted the urgent need for land to be released in Dalwallinu. From the meeting it was clear that growth is a big issue for the State Government whether it is a small rural Council like ours or a large metro Council like Joondalup.

The Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Station went live on Tuesday 5 October 2023. Within the first couple of hours we had our first customer. We hope the ability to re-charge electric vehicles will entice more visitors to the Shire.

The Shire of Dalwallinu Youth Advisory Council (YAC) have commenced preparations to turn one of the rooms at the Discovery Centre into a teen space. We recently ran a competition to 'Name the Space'.

We didn't receive a large response and as a result the YAC named the area themselves and it will be known as the Youth Lounge.

We have purchased a 4-1 games table and will be setting up the space in the coming weeks. It will be open for 11-18 year olds, 8 days a fortnight between the hours of 3:30pm – 5:00pm.

We held a 'Hollywood Bingo Night' community event on Friday 13

October 2023. This event was well attended with nearly 100 people enjoying a fun night. Many thanks to the staff for assisting me with the set up and packing up for the event.

Congratulations to the Kalannie CRC for organising a roller-skating disco on 28 October 2023 at the Kalannie Town Hall. As an avid roller-skater as a youth, I am sure the children enjoyed the night.

Just a reminder that the Annual Street Party will be held on Friday 8 December 2023, jointly hosted by the Shire of Dalwallinu and the Dalwallinu Lions Club. We have plenty of activities for the children, a DJ and a bar in the park.

Congratulations to the Councillors who were elected unopposed for the recent October Local Government Elections. Steven Carter, Melissa Harms and Jimwell Cruz received four (4) year terms and Keith Carter received a two (2) year term. At the Ordinary Council Meeting held 24 October 2023, Cr Keith Carter was re-elected as Shire President and Cr Steve Carter was re-elected as Deputy Shire President for the next two (2) years.

In the last couple of months we farewelled Chris Knight and Michael Hare and welcomed Irumve (Bobby) Nkunkumuye (Causal General Hand) and Ellen Jeffery (Casual Cleaner).

Apologies that we did not have an October edition of the Dally News. Our Executive Assistant (Deb) recently went overseas on a well-deserved break.

At the Ordinary Council meeting held 26 September 2023, Council resolved to enter into a another three (3) year contract for the provision of Medical Services with Three Sons Pty Ltd (Dr Femi). We thank Dr Femi for wishing to remain in Dalwallinu to provide medical services to our community.

The refurbishment to the town hall is nearly complete. We are just waiting for the floor to be sealed and we had enough money left in the budget for the internal walls to be painted.

Youth Advisory Committee News

The YAC met in October to finalise a name for our new teen space. We received some interesting suggestions from our name the space competition and ultimately "Youth Lounge" was selected as the new name.

Our next project while we wait for our furniture to ship and continue clearing out the site, is to find creative kids to design some original works. Having artwork created by local youths will be a great way for them to feel some ownership

In October 2023 after 12 years on Council Karen McNeill made the difficult decision to not restand the Council elections. Karen and Greg will shortly be moving onto a new phase of their lives and will eventually relocate to Albany once their new home is finished.

I asked Karen to sit and chat with me and, although a reluctant interviewee, she did agree. The one thing that shines through from Karen when speaking with her is passion and commitment. Commitment to the Council, the community to family and friends and her passion for them all.

Karen was born and grew up in Dalwallinu and always wanted to give back to the community that she loved. In 2011 an opportunity arose when a position on Council in October became vacant.

Karen quietly filed her intentions and

without too much fanfare awaited the outcomes. The result of that election proved her popularity as it is public record she amassed the most votes of all in that election and was elected with resounding support from her community.

In the intervening 12 years she assisted on Council with steering the community through some challenging times. When I asked her to reflect on some of the challenges and outcomes she was proudest of it she found it hard to pinpoint just one but narrowed it down to a few highlights.

Firstly, to see the expansion of the Recreation Centre from the initial stages through to completion was absolutely one of the highlights of her time on Council. The Bell Street subdivision was another development that was so desperately needed for housing within the township and was a very satisfying outcome for the entire Council when the blocks sold so quickly.

The Multi Purpose Early Childhood Learning Centre was the last major project in Karen's time and again a pleasure to see completed. These highlights are offset with also having to make difficult decisions for the community such as the re-assessment of the Medical Centre and the eventual privatisation of it, for it to run autonomously from the Shire which was hugely debated before the outcome was decided.

Overall, Karen said her focus has always been on the betterment of the community and the Shire of Dalwallinu as a whole. Karen has always known what she believes in, what she wants to do and most importantly how to work towards achieving best outcomes for all. She remains passionate about the community and her heart will always remain in Dally even when she moves.

As a fitting tribute to her time as a Councillor and in her capacity as Justice of the Peace, CEO Jean

Knight invited Karen to swear in the new Councillors on October 24 just prior to their first Council Meeting. Karen took the chance to address the forum before swearing in the new Councillors.

She took the opportunity to firstly thank the Electors of the Shire for voting to elect her as a Councillor in 2011. She stated it had been a privilege to serve and represent the community and people of the Dalwallinu Shire for the last 12 years. She will definitely miss being involved in local government and local committees, but she is also looking forward to new beginnings.

Karen counts herself lucky to have been part of such a progressive Council and although some decisions had been very long winded and tough at times, she believes Council have made good decisions and outcomes for the Shire and its people.

Karen also took the time to thank Shire staff, especially CEO Jean Knight and her Executive team for their professionalism and forward thinking and for the information provided to Council to enable the

growth of the Dalwallinu Shire. She stated that the facilities within the Shire have all been improved no end and all staff should all be proud of what has been achieved.

And finally, Karen addressed Jimwell Cruz to welcome him to the team. She stated she was sure Jim will bring new light and feedback to the table. Karen then addressed all Councillors and staff in attendance and wished them all the very best for the future and assured them she will always be interested in what is happening in and around Dalwallinu.

She finished with the statement "Having been born and bred in Dalwallinu, having raised our own family here, having farmed and worked and run a small business alongside our family, made lifelong friends and developed our interests in Dalwallinu this place will always be home."

We wish Karen well as she pursues this next chapter of her life alongside her husband Greg and thank her for her service.

Councillors are sworn in for new Term on Council

Council elections were scheduled for Saturday 16 October, 2023. Due to only four people nominating for the four vacant positions they were all elected unopposed. Councillors were sworn in by former Councillor Karen McNeill in her capacity as Justice of the Peace on Tuesday 24 October 2023.

Three terms of four (4) years were available and one term of two (2) years. A ballot was held prior to the meeting and Cr Keith Carter was awarded the two (2) year term. This means he can recontest at the next election in 2025 whilst the remaining 3 Councillors, Cr Steven Carter, Cr Jimwell Cruz and Cr Melissa Harms terms all expire in 2027.

We congratulate all returning Councillors and welcome our newest Councillor Jimwell Cruz. They join the remaining three (3) Councillors Cr Jemma Counsel, Cr Noel Mills and Cr Diane Cream to form the 2023 Shire of Dalwallinu Council.

Team-work and skills transferable to other sports were heavily emphasised by Coach Jason. All participants had a blast and were certainly exhausted by the end of day three.

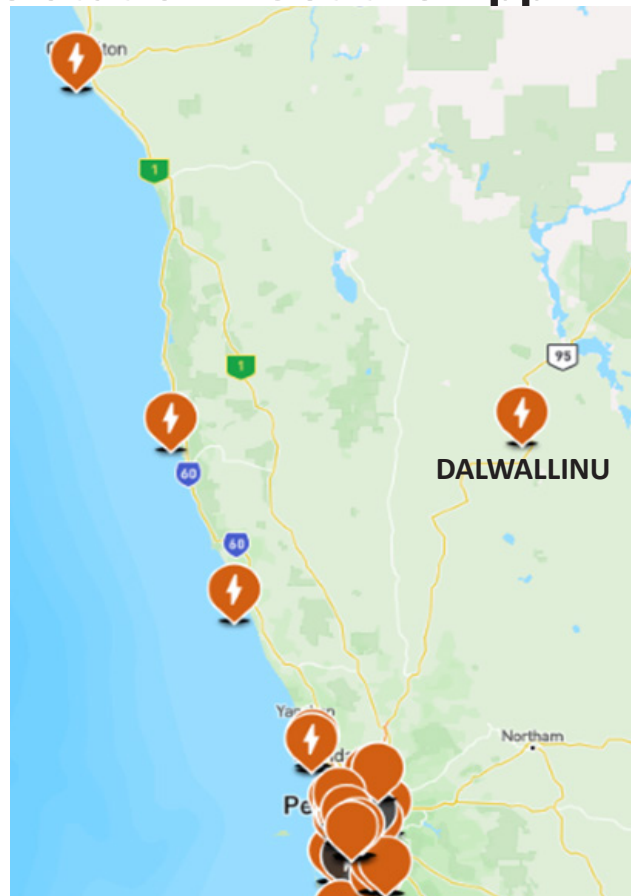
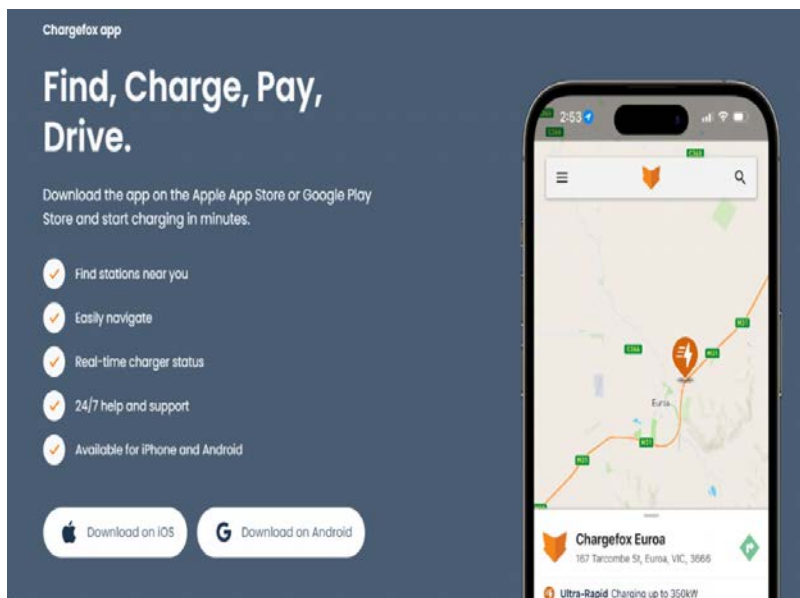
As there are no programs over the December holidays we are currently researching options for something fun to do during the April break.

Purchased to provide power at emergency centres during a power outage. To be installed at the Kalannie Recreation Centre.






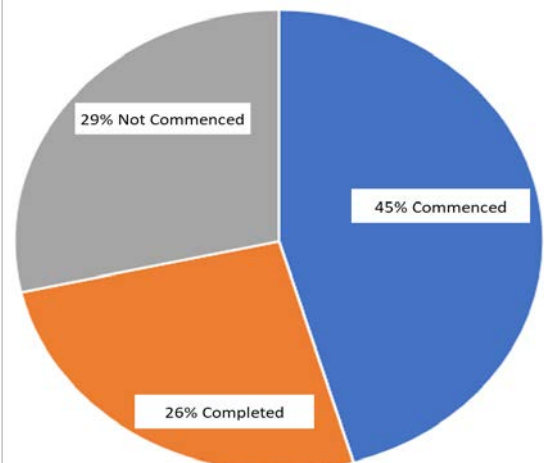

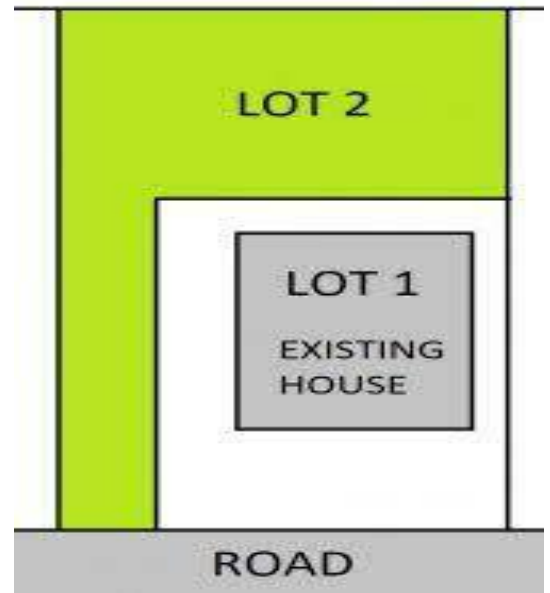

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life.

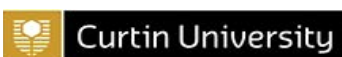
By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are more likely to explore rural career opportunities and have a better understanding of treating rural patients.

Cat & Dog Registrations were due Tuesday 31 October 2023

If you have forgotten to register your Cats or Dogs please contact the Shire as soon as possible to ensure they are all registered. We encourage responsible pet ownership.

The new cat laws are about encouraging responsible pet ownership and reducing the number of unwanted cats in the community and the number that are euthanised each year. All cats that have reached six months of age are required by law to be:

- microchipped
- sterilised; and
- registered with the Shire



Under The Dog Act 1976 and regulations, any dog over the age of 3 months should be registered within the Shire.

All dogs need to be microchipped. Proof of microchipping is required at time of registration.

Please be a responsible owner and secure your animals by registration.
