An official opening for the new community space project in Pithara was held on Thursday 30 April 2026.

This project included the erection of a fence, installation of a shelter and seating, new play equipment, a half-court basketball, a BBQ, drink fountain along with some hard and soft landscaping.

Thank you to Andy & Deb Russell for their donation towards this project.

It is fantastic to see that the last three lots in the industrial subdivision have now been placed under contract. We will be in discussions with DevelopmentWA regarding future residential and industrial land releases in the coming weeks.

Project Updates

- The upgrades at the Dalwallinu Aquatic Centre are currently being undertaken. This involves the removal and replacement of the 25M Pool liner and completion of the balance tank upgrade.
- The upgrade to the lighting on Dalwallinu Oval is nearing completion. The standing up and commissioning of the lights is due to occur in mid

May 2026.

- The two homes at 68 Annetts Rd, Dalwallinu have been completed and handover will take place in the coming weeks.
- The two new aged units will be delivered to site 21-22 May 2026. Clearing works have commenced in preparation for delivery.
- The Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network road projects have now been completed.

We are waiting for the final concept for the proposed upgrade to Memorial Park. Once Council has endorsed the final draft concept plan, this will be put out to the community for their feedback. Council will consider the feedback and finalise the plan.

The next stage will be to obtain an

estimated cost which will guide Council on whether the project will proceed or not.

A big shoutout to Adam Reeves for changing my tyre on a recent trip to Perth. This was very much appreciated.

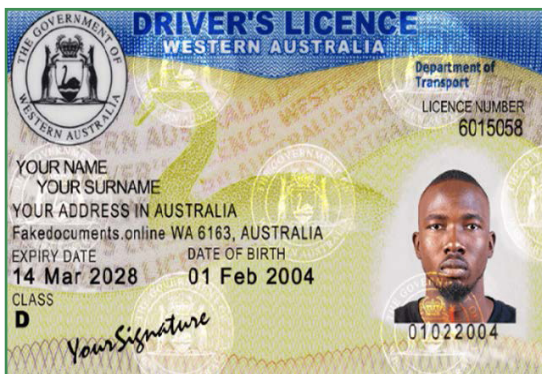
Honour to CEO

Knight shift: Jean Knight JP brings regional lens to Local Government Professionals WA Board

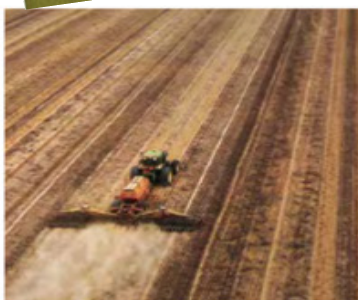

Jean will represent the Board at Avon Midlands Branch meetings and is a regular attendee at the State Conference, CEO forums and other events—opportunities she sees as essential for building meaningful relationships.

"A meaningful connection for me is a relationship where you feel understood, engaged, emotionally safe and free to express yourself. I hope when I speak with other members, they will feel that connection."

Jean brings strengths in corporate governance, financial management and organisational risk, paired with a practical mindset that ensures strategy and policy remain achievable and genuinely useful for members.

"I'm not afraid to ask hard questions, and I believe good outcomes come from collaboration, listening and keeping the organisation's purpose front of mind."

"This is a key part of good governance. It means the organisation is run for its members, by trusted leaders, in a transparent, ethical and effective way, so members feel represented, confident and proud to be part of it."

Re-purposing of Pioneer House

Pioneer House situated on Lot 567 (27) McNeill Street, Dalwallinu was previously leased by WA Country Health Service (WACHS) for aged care. The facility has not been utilised for this purpose for many years and in early 2026 WACHS advised that they wished to terminate the lease agreement.

Whilst the demand for a building set up for aged care purposes such as Pioneer House is not required at this time, it is unknown if this kind of facility may be required in the future. In the short-term, Council has resolved to utilise this building for shared workers accommodation. Availability of accommodation in Dalwallinu is extremely low and single person workers accommodation is even less common.

The proposed criteria for this workers accommodation facility is:

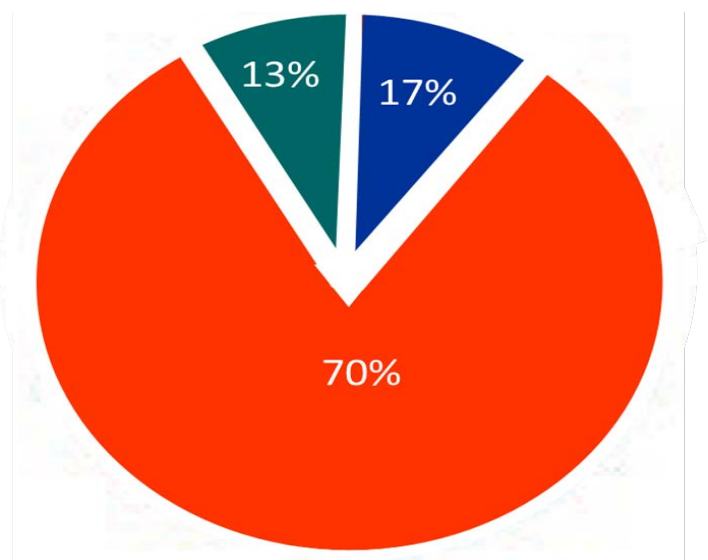
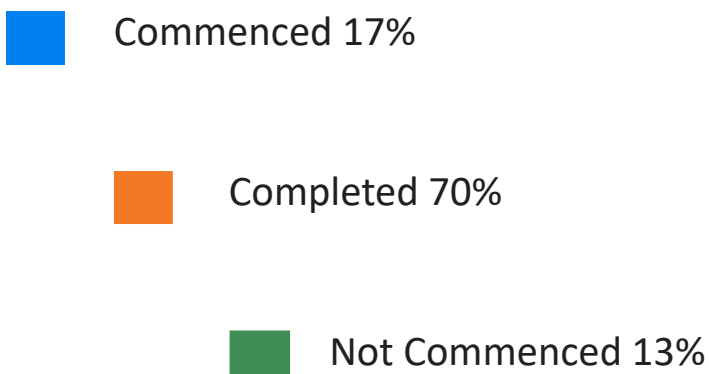
- Must be a current employee of a business in the Shire of Dalwallinu throughout the tenancy. Should they become unemployed the tenancy will be terminated

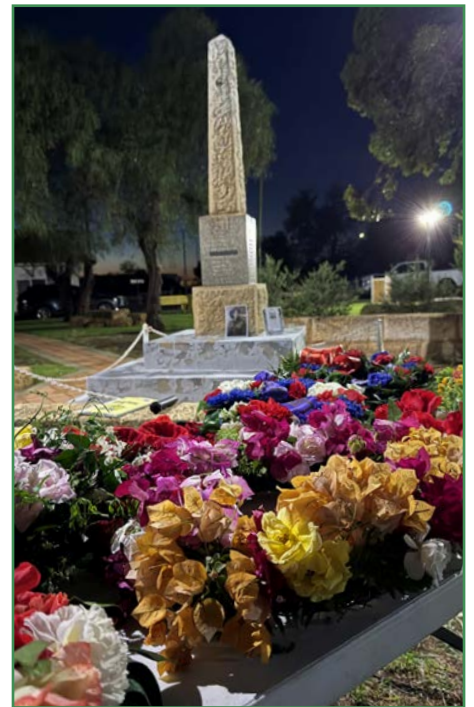


Anzac Day 2026

John Grisham – John Ray Grisham Jr born 8 February 1955 is an American writer, lawyer, and former politician, known for his best-selling legal thrillers.

Grisham has written 37 consecutive number one fiction bestsellers, and his books have sold 300 million copies worldwide.

He practiced criminal law for about a decade and served in the Mississippi House of Representatives from 1983 to 1990. Grisham's first novel, *A Time to Kill*, was published in June 1989, four years after he began writing it.

Seven of his other novels have also been adapted into films: *The Chamber*, *The Client*, *A Painted House*, *The Pelican Brief*, *The Rainmaker*, *The Runaway Jury*, and *Skippering Christmas*.

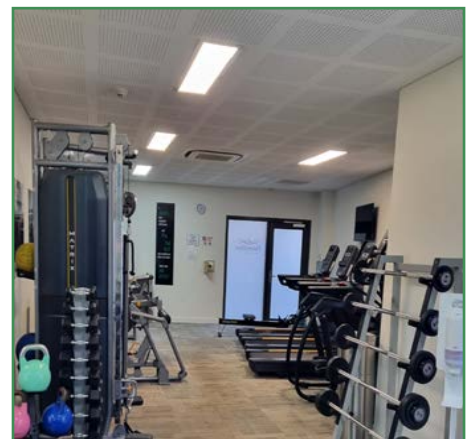
Shire of Dalwallinu - 24 Hour Gym

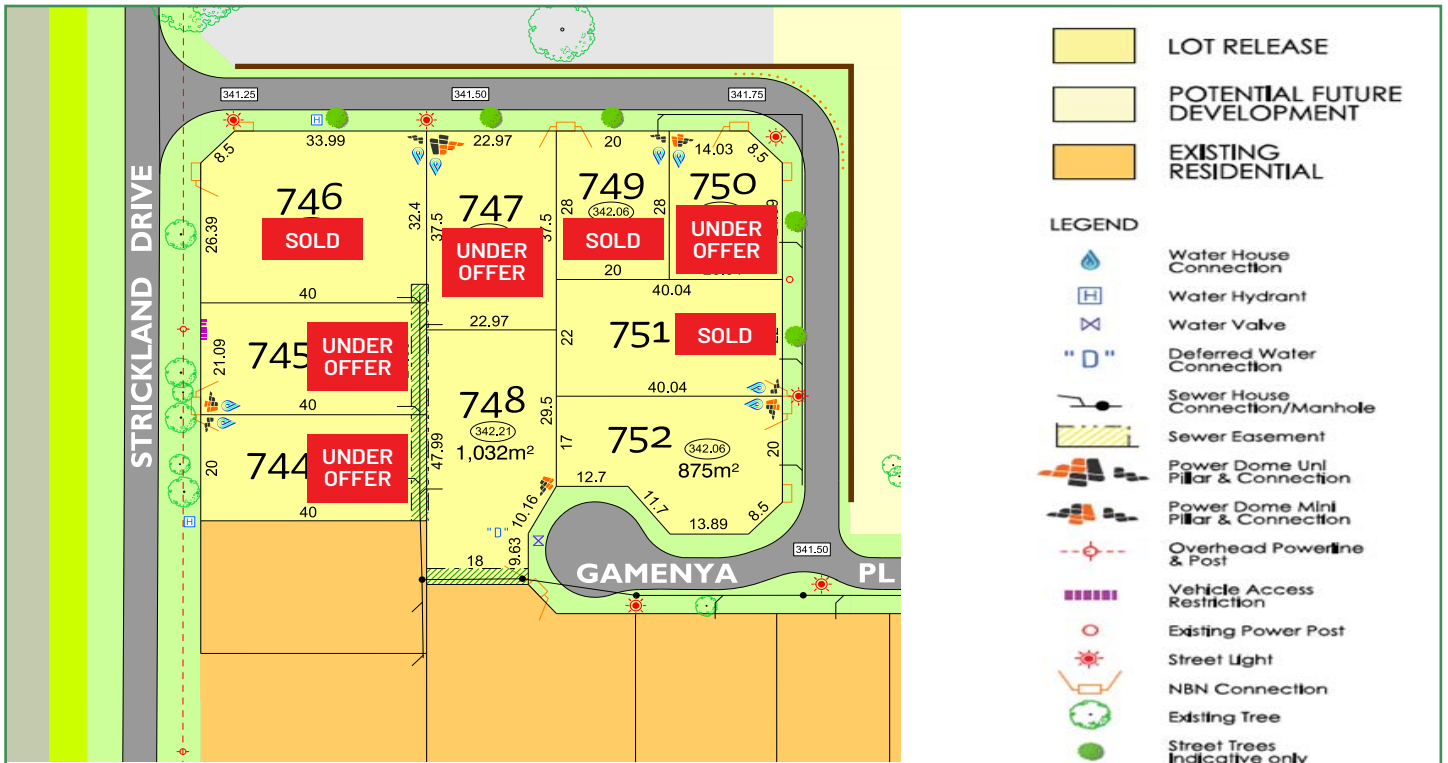

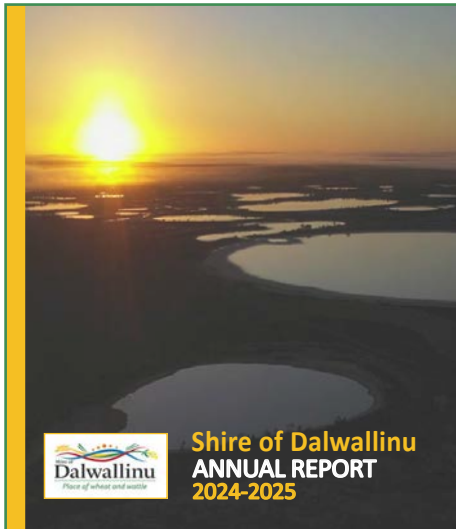
